# 2009 Morgan-Black International EC12 Championship Regatta October 7 through October 10, 2009 James Island County Park Charleston, South Carolina, USA

### 1. Management

- a. The American Model Yachting Association East Coast 12 Meter Class will administer and conduct the Regatta.
- b. The Regatta will begin with boat and sail measurements on 7 October. Fleet racing will be 8, 9 and 10 October.
- c. Organized international groups shall submit a ranking list of their group competitors for seeding considerations.

#### 2. Venue

- a. The Regatta will be held at the James Island County Park (JICP), a facility under the management of Charleston County Parks and Recreation Commission. - b. GPS lake and parking location is: N32 43.988 W79 59.152.

#### 3. Rules

a. The Regatta will be governed by the 2009-2012 Racing Rules of Sailing (RRS) as modified by appendix E, the prescriptions of US Sailing when they apply, the rules of the national authority and/or EC12 Class, this NOR and the sailing instructions.

## 4. Eligibility

- a. International participants will follow these guidelines:
  - i. Members of an EC12 Class with in their authority where one exists.
  - ii. Enter a boat recognizable as an EC12 under a national authority or a boat from a US manufactured hull under no authority.
- b. United States participants must be current members of the American Model Yachting Association (AMYA) and the yachts shall be properly registered within the class.

## 5. Entry

- The Regatta will be restricted to 36 boat entries.
- b. International entries shall be up to and including 24 boats.
- c. United States entries will be at least 12 entries and any remaining not filled.
- d. United States entries will be chosen from the class ranking list of those entered.
- e. The current Cup holder shall head the entries as defender.
- f. Should there be a serious overflow of international entries consensus will be taken for a third fleet.
- g. Eligible competitors may enter the regatta by completing and returning the official entry form, together with payment for all fees, to the address shown on the form.
- h. The registration period for the Regatta will be begin at the discretion of the country organizing groups and all entries are to be processed no later than September 1, 2009.

#### 6. Schedule

a. Check in and measurements will be held on Wednesday October 7 between 13.00 and 14.00. Mock racing on the courses will be available during this day. Fleet racing will be daily, October 8 – 10, from 09.15 to about 16.00. An awards banquet will begin about 18.30 the evening of the 10th. A detailed schedule will be provided nearer to the Regatta date.

# 7. Fleet Management and Scoring

a. The Regatta will be conducted using the Equal Opportunity Racing System (EORS), a fleet promotion relegation process and scoring will be the Low Point Scoring System located in the Appendix A of the RRS. There will be two heats of 20 boats each per race.

#### 8. Prizes

- a. Trophies will be awarded to the top five positions.
- b. The Morgan Black Trophy will be inscribed and presented to the National Class or Authority. This trophy is perpetual and the responsibility of the National Class or Authority.
- c. Photos will be taken with the Morgan Black Trophy and sent to the participants.
